

#### Lunches

Universal Free School Meals continue to be available for all Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils daily. For all Key Stage 2 pupils, hot lunches can be ordered at a cost of £2.60 per day or £13.00 per week. All meals must be ordered on the App and paid for in advance.

Please can ALL parents book their child's meals for the half term on Reach More Parents even if they are eligible for a free meal.

Christmas Dinner will be on Wednesday 18 December – please order by 2 December at the latest.



# **Pupil Premium/Free School Meals**

Extra funding is available for school to support the education of children from families in receipt of certain benefits (including funding for Free School Meals at all Key Stages). If you think that you might be eligible, please apply online at <a href="https://parentportal.wiltshire.gov.uk/web/portal/pages/home">https://parentportal.wiltshire.gov.uk/web/portal/pages/home</a> or ask for a form in confidence from the School Office. It is important that parents complete this form even if your child is in Reception/Key Stage 1 pupil, as it means that we will receive additional funding to spend on supporting your child throughout his/her school career, and to subsidise additional school expenses such as swimming, trips and music lessons. Pupil premium children are also entitled to free milk, even after their 5<sup>th</sup> birthdays.

#### Tuck

Tuck is available for all children in years 1 - 6 to buy on Tuesday mornings at playtime. Please send your child in with 20p if they wish to buy a homemade cake/biscuit from the school kitchen.

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# **Healthy Eating and Nut Allergies**

We promote healthy eating and encourage the children to make healthy food choices. Children in Years R – 2 receive a free fruit snack each day. Children in other year groups may bring in fruit to eat at breaktime. If children are bringing packed lunches, please do not include sweets and chocolate in their meals. To ensure that our Healthy Eating Policy is inclusive, please do not bring in sweets or cakes to give out on birthdays.

As we have some children in school who are allergic to nuts, please do not send in nuts or nut products in lunchboxes. We do not use nuts or nut products in school meals, and a list of allergens is provided on the school meal planner. Please speak to Mrs Carpenter, our Catering Manager, if you have any queries or special dietary requests.

#### **Music Lessons**

Music lessons are billed directly via the Salisbury Music Co-operative. If you hire a St Andrew's school instrument, we will be in touch about paying the hire charge of £15 per term (£45 annually).

Classes 3 and 4 are having whole class recorder lessons weekly with Mrs Maguire on Monday afternoons (there is no charge to parents for these lessons).

Classes 5 and 6 will continue to access weekly ukulele lessons for the rest of the autumn term. Again, there is no cost to parents.

# **Class Cooking**

During the school year, all classes will have the opportunity to cook, which is an important skill and something that the children really enjoy doing. They will be able to bring home their products to share with you. To cover the cost of ingredients we ask for a one-off voluntary contribution of £3. If you have not already paid, please do so via the school app.

# Attendance

We would like to remind all parents that the regulations governing term-time holidays do not now permit Headteachers to authorise any term-time leave for pupils unless there are <u>exceptional</u> circumstances".

Regular, punctual attendance at school is important for your child's progress. Please help us by ensuring that your child is in school punctually (school starts at 8.30am) and that children are not taken out of school during term-time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Every child's attendance is monitored each half-term and we may contact the parents of those children whose attendance is below 97%, or otherwise giving cause for concern, so that we can discuss their attendance further.

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### **Parent Helpers**

We are delighted to welcome parent helpers at our school. If you would like to support with reading, cooking, gardening or any other activities then please let us know. All helpers must have a DBS check prior to volunteering which can be arranged with the school office.

#### Uniform

Please ensure that all uniform is named (especially sweatshirts) as this helps us to return stray items.

#### **PE Kits**

All children need to have a PE kit in school every day, including trainers suitable for outdoor activity. PE kits can be brought into school in a bag which can be hung on the children's pegs. If your child has earrings, they should remove these for PE and sporting activities. If they are unable to do this, then the earrings need to be covered by plasters for PE lessons. On Wednesdays, children may have PE lessons **outside** with our Sports Coach, so in colder weather they may need tracksuit bottoms.

#### Travel to and from school

We would like to remind all parents that for safety reasons, you should <u>not park or drive along the lane at the side of school</u> before or after school. Parents must not use the staff car park for parking or turning, and under no circumstances should children be allowed to walk across the staff car park.

We are working with the other local schools and the Council to try to promote sustainable journeys and would like to encourage as many families as possible to walk or cycle to school. There are scooter racks and a bike rack in school for our children's use, and you can sign up to the HomeRunApp <a href="www.homerun-app.com/stava2930">www.homerun-app.com/stava2930</a> to try to organise lift shares if you live outside the village.

Please park considerately and be mindful of the new parking restrictions.

### **Mobile Phones**

If your child <u>must</u> bring a mobile phone to school, it <u>must</u> be handed into the office first thing in the morning and collected at the end of the day. Children are not allowed phones during the day, in line with our Online Safety Policy. The telephone in the school office is always available for children to contact their parents or for you to phone if you need to get a message to your child. Unless it is absolutely necessary, we would discourage children from bringing phones to school in the first place. <u>The school can accept no responsibility for any loss or damage to phones</u>.

# **Changes of Details**

Please let us know straight away if you have a change of personal details (especially phone numbers) or if you wish to change any of the contacts that we have for your child/ren. It is also important that we are notified of any changes to medical/dietary information, or any of the consents that we hold for your child/ren. We have published forms on our school app (click on the 'Forms' globe) so that you can notify us of any changes as soon as they occur. Thank you.
