AREAS OF LEARNING

As Writers we will...

- explore plurals and adding s, es to root words
- create our own versions of 'oi frog' using our new knowledge of plurals and rhyming
- continue to focus on our letter formation within our writing



As Readers we will...

- read the 'oi frog' series of books and enjoy exploring rhyming words
- continue to work in our reading groups to improve our fluency and reading with expression



As Mathematicians we will...

- continue to explore place value of numbers 11-20
- explore addition and subtraction within 20
- learn to recognise different coins
- count in 2s, 5s and 10s



As Sportspeople we will ...

- develop the skills of balancing, running, changing direction, jumping, hopping and skipping
- explore these skills in isolation as well as in combination

Please make sure that your child has a named P.E. kit in school



As Computer Scientists we will ...

- choose a command for a given practise
- show that a series of commands can be joined together
- identify the effects of changing a value



As Musicians we will

- copy call-and-response patterns with voices and instruments.
- echo sing a line independently with teacher leading, then move on to pair singing in echo format.
- create musical phrases from new word rhythms that children invent.
- sing either part of a call-and-response song.



As Engineers we will

- enjoy a range of children's board books and pop up books and explore what types of movements are found in them
- explore and make different mechanisms (levers, sliders and wheels)
- create our own moving pictures



As Geographers we will

- use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of our school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.



Homework

Each week a phonics sheet related to our learning will be sent home with your child. This does not need to be returned to school, but if it could be completed it will give your child the opportunity to practise their phonics skills and apply it to their writing.

If possible listen to your child read daily, as this will really help to develop their fluency and comprehension skills. If you have any questions, please do contact one of us.
