**Facts For Life**

1. Mary Seacole was a herbalist from Jamaica who fought to help others.
2. Florence Nightingale was best known for improving the sanitation and hygiene within nursing.
3. Edith Cavell was most known for her belief that ALL soldiers should be helped, despite which side they were on.

**Key Vocabulary**

<b>battlefield</b>	A place where soldiers fight in war.
<b>First World War</b>	(1914-1918) First World War or World War I.
<b>hospital</b>	A building where doctors and nurses take care of people who are ill or injured.
<b>nurse</b>	Somebody who takes care of people who are sick or injured.
<b>patients</b>	People who are being looked after by nurses and doctors.
<b>soldier</b>	A person who is trained to fight in wars.



**Key People**

<b>Mary Seacole</b>	Mary Seacole was a <b>nurse</b> . Her mother was Jamaican and her father was Scottish. She travelled from Jamaica to look after wounded <b>soldiers</b> on the <b>battlefield</b> . She set up a <b>hospital</b> called the British Hotel to look after <b>soldiers</b> .
<b>Florence Nightingale</b>	Florence Nightingale was a <b>nurse</b> . She made <b>hospitals</b> cleaner for <b>patients</b> and looked after <b>soldiers</b> . She set up the Nightingale Training School for <b>nurses</b> in 1860.
<b>Edith Cavell</b>	Edith Cavell was a <b>nurse</b> in the <b>First World War</b> . She saved <b>soldiers</b> from both sides during the <b>First World War</b> . Edith helped over 200 <b>soldiers</b> escape from the German army.
