Mary Seacole	Mary Seacole was a nurse . Her mother was Jamaican and her father was Scottish. She travelled from Jamaica to look after wounded soldiers on the battlefield . She set up a hospital called the British Hotel to look after soldiers .
Florence Nightingale	Florence Nightingale was a nurse. She made hospitals cleaner for patients and looked after soldiers. She set up the Nightingale Training School for nurses in 1860.
Edith Cavell	Edith Cavell was a nurse in the First World War. She saved soldiers from both sides during the First World War. Edith helped over 200 soldiers escape from the German army.
