Mary Seacole	Mary Seacole was a nurse . Her mother was Jamaican and her father was Scottish. She travelled from Jamaica to look after wounded soldiers on the battlefield . She set up a hospital called the British Hotel to look after soldiers .	
Florence Nightingale	Florence Nightingale was a nurse. She made hospitals cleaner for patients and looked after soldiers. She set up the Nightingale Training School for nurses in 1860.	
a nurs Crime	Edith Cavell was a nurse in the First World War. She saved soldiers from both sides during the First 1856 The Crimean War ends. Mary returns to England. 1896 Edith becomes a nurse. 1855 Mary Seacole pays for herself to travel to treat soldiers in the Crimean War. 1865 Edith Cavell is born. 1914 First World War breaks out.	
1805 Mary Seacc	1854 Florence goes to nurse soldiers in the Crimean War. 1860 Florence sets up her nursing school. 1907 Edith takes charge of the training school in Brussels.
