1. Our Core Values

We know that God loves us and show it by being loving, honest and respectful. (Reviewed with staff, governors, children and parents 2018)
Our 3 Christian values are Love, Honesty and Respect.
(Rephrased from September 2023)

2. Introduction

As a Church of England aided school, collective worship is always Christian. We believe that Christian worship should involve and interest all members of the school community enabling them to discover God's place in their lives.

3. Aims

- a. To place ourselves in the presence of God and to see worship as relevant to everyday life.
- b. To promote spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of pupils.
- c. To achieve a balanced programme to facilitate worship.
- d. To be seen as an integral part of the whole Christian ethos of the school.
- e. To strengthen the community of the school and to prepare for opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life.
- f. To become more sensitive to the wonders and mysteries of creation.

4. Objectives

- a. All members of the school community will establish a sense of belonging i.e. we are **all God's Children**.
- b. To contribute to the religious education and spiritual development of all pupils.
- c. The children will experience different forms of Christian worship by participation and involvement.
- d. Each activity should be educational as well as spiritual.
- e. Children will experience an interesting and varied programme of Collective Worship.
- f. Children will be encouraged to take part in Christian practices e.g. responses, introduction to Holy Communion at St. Andrew's Church, prayer, reflection etc.

5. Implementation/approach

Our Collective Worship will:

- a. Provide opportunities for thought, reflection and silence.
- b. Create and develop an environment conducive to worship and reflection.
- c. Use appropriate language and explanations to enable pupils to understand the content.
- d. Renew our Christian values and help the children to find a sense of belonging.
- e. Promote feelings of awe and wonder, love, compassion and understanding of personal relationships.
- f. Provide opportunities for pupil involvement.

6. Organisation

St Andrew's School Collective Worship is organised as follows:

Monday 10:20am Whole School (including EYFS)

Led by head teacher, deputy head or visitor

Tuesday 10:20am Classes 3-6 (Key Stage 2) in hall led by teachers.

Classes R-2 (Key Stage 1) Class Worship in classrooms led

by teachers and/or pupils (at any time of the day)

Wednesday 10am Whole School (including EYFS) Open the Book

Thursday 8:45am Classes R-2 (Key Stage 1) in hall led by

teachers

Years 3-6 Class Worship in classrooms led by class

teachers and/or pupils (at any time of the day)

Friday 8:45am Whole School worship (including EYFS) Celebration –

Headteacher/Deputy Head

It is important to establish a sense of community within the school; therefore, whole school Collective Worship on Fridays will include sharing their successes with the school. These will include, rewarding fantastic learning (bubbling learners, passport certificates), amazing lunchtime manners (special table) and recognition of great attitudes and conduct (golden moments.) Our special values certificates are also presented in this worship in recognition of children demonstrating outstanding love, honesty or respect.

Visitors from St Andrews Church, other Christian churches and organisations will be welcome to lead collective worship, subject to the approval of the Headteacher and Governors. All staff are expected to be present and lead collective worship. Collective Worship will take place in the hall, classrooms or reflection area.

7. Content continuity/progression

Collective Worship may include some or all of the following:

Music Played as the children enter the hall

Lighting of candles Children bring candles from classrooms to unite the

school community

Signed Response by children: Jesus said, "I am the light of the World",

Response signed by all "May he bring light to our lives and work

today."

Hymn

Drama To illustrate stories in the Bible - Old and New Testament

Poems/Story/Discussion (opportunities for sharing/talking) sharing of

knowledge and information

Prayer Led by child or teacher

Lord's Prayer (said and signed in Makaton)

The Grace Silent Reflection

Bible Reading Relevant reading by adult or child (from a variety of

translations and paraphrases)

Extinguishing candle Response by children:

"We take this light of Christ"

Response signed by all "To shine in our hearts today."

At the end of worship, after the candles have been put out, we may also include notices and school community news

The whole school will take part in a church service at least twice during each academic year.

The Autumn Term service will be a Holy Communion Service on St Andrew's Day. All the children will receive a blessing at the altar and people who receive communion in their own church are welcomed to take communion.

The Spring Term service will be a Holy Communion Service celebrating Easter. All the children will receive a blessing at the altar and people who receive communion in their own church are welcomed to take communion.

There may also be a Summer Term service, which will be a Holy Communion Service. All the children will receive a blessing at the altar and people who receive communion in their own church are welcomed to take communion.

In the final term there will be a church service for the children in Year 6 who will be leaving the school. Their families are welcome to attend.

In planning our Collective Worship Themes, we have considered the two main dimensions of spiritual thought.

- A) Implicit concerned with children's personal feelings, relationships, experiences, questions and responses to life, and
- B) Explicit a body of knowledge, the ways in which religious communities express their belief, behaviour and values.

These two dimensions are to link closely with the religious education policy of the school and the curriculum links within each class.

The main themes of Collective Worship contain both implicit and explicit material. A theme can be developed or extended within the individual classroom.

These main themes are revisited annually using different material. Favourite stories may be revisited on a regular basis.

The RE and Collective Worship co-ordinator will plan the themes for each term, and suggest activities for class worship, thus ensuring continuity across the school.

The themes used are planned on a three year cycle to ensure both variety and development deeper understanding. The current cycle of planning is attached to this policy.

It is to be noted that our Collective Worship will allow for the unexpected, ie local/world events when the occasion arises.

8. Resources

- a. Resources (including music, songbooks, artefacts and other resources) will be reviewed and updated as necessary.
- b. Further resources can be borrowed from the Wiltshire and Swindon Learning Resources.
- c. We currently subscribe to 'Picture News' ensuring that Key Stage worship allows us to reflect on our place in the world and our impact on it.

9. Legal status

- a. This Collective Worship Policy complies with the legal requirements of the 1988 Education Act. It is also in accordance with the Trust Deed of St Andrew's School.
- b. This policy was drawn up by the staff, the Headteacher and Governors.
- c. Miss Hodgson is RE Coordinator for the school and therefore has responsibility for collective worship in school.

10. Rights of withdrawal

- a. Staff in Voluntary Aided Schools **do not** have the right of withdrawal from any act of worship whatever their own religious stance.
- b. It is expected that all pupils will be present at acts of worship but the school respects the right of parents to withdraw their children. Each individual's integrity is respected.

11. Monitoring

This policy will be monitored by each leader of collective worship over the next school year. The Collective Worship coordinator will then arrange meeting with staff to discuss any review of the policy at the end of the year. Any alterations or amendments will be discussed with the Governors.

12. Review dates

This policy was most recently reviewed in **October 2024**The next review will be in the **Autumn Term 2025**

13. Themes for collective workshop (see also attached Three Yearly Plan). The Themes are taken the 'Values for Life' and 'Fruits of the Spirit'.

New school year, Harvest, Caring, Attitudes, Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Celebrations, Christian year, Senses, Water, The Elements, Miracles, Bible and Prayer, Parables, Feelings and Emotions, Talents and Gifts, Learning about God, Seasons, Special People, Jesus, Faith, Creation, Time, Worship, Belonging and Home.
