30/10	<b>Our School Rules</b>  Love Honesty Respect	<a href="#">Honesty</a>	<a href="#">1 Peter 3: 10-12</a>	Remind ourselves that Honesty is one of our school's Christian Values that we selected because of its importance to us. Explore the concept that it can take courage to be honest, especially if we have made a mistake. Why might people be tempted to fib? Why is honesty the right thing if it feels difficult? Role-play scenarios 2 ways: honest/dishonest. E.g. have not done homework, broke something expensive accidentally. Revisit the story of <a href="#">Zacchaeus</a> that we ended last term with – we were looking at love then, but how is this story also a good example of honesty?
6/11	<b>Armistice (Peace)</b>	<a href="#">War Game</a> (AH has book )	<a href="#">John 15:13</a>	The <a href="#">Royal British Legion</a> website has a variety of resources suitable for use in worship. There are varied resources, videos and lesson plans available on the site that link well and show how the British Legion use funds to support families of service members. Children could plan and deliver a service that they feel is appropriate to commemorate the fallen.
13/11	<b>Anti – Bullying (13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> Nov)</b> Mon 13 <sup>th</sup> – Odd Socks Day 17/11 Children in Need	<a href="#">BBC Clips</a>	<a href="#">Romans 12: 20-21</a>	Resources for assemblies (and follow up lessons) are available on <a href="#">The Anti-Bullying Alliance website</a> . The theme this year is 'Make a Noise Against Bullying.' Use a clip/s from the BBC selection that is age appropriate to open discussion about bullying. Re-cap the anti-bullying poster displayed in the classroom, especially the traffic lights and STOP.
21/11	<b>Gentleness</b>	<a href="#">Gentleness</a> (up to 4:10 only)	<a href="#">Titus 3:2</a>	In John 8:5-7 the Pharisees brought a woman who had done wrong to Jesus. They wanted her to be punished and hurt for what she had done. Jesus explained that only people who had

				never done anything wrong should decide to punish her. Jesus showed that gentleness was the way to treat others. You could act this out as a short drama and watch the clip on the left to help understanding. When have we been able to show gentleness like Jesus did?
27/11	<b>St Andrew (30<sup>th</sup> November)</b>	<a href="#">Story of St Andrew</a>	<a href="#">Matthew 4: 18-22</a>	See if anyone can recall a bible story that has St Andrew in it, before watching the clip. (Feeding the 5,000.) How do we celebrate St Andrew's day at school? How is it <a href="#">celebrated in Scotland</a> where he is the patron saint? Discuss other countries that have St Andrew as their patron saint, <a href="#">and how they celebrate his day.</a> Practice our line in our St Andrew's Prayer
4/12	<b>Advent Patience</b>	<a href="#">Advent Wreath</a>	<a href="#">Isaiah 40: 9-11</a>	What does Advent mean? (Waiting) What are we waiting for? It may seem like we are waiting for Father Christmas, family visits, presents etc, but what are we really waiting for? Use the clip on the left to explain the significance of the <a href="#">advent ring we</a> will have in worship over the next four weeks.
11/12	<b>Christmas Joy</b>	<a href="#">Peace on Earth</a>	<a href="#">Isaiah 9: 6-7</a>	Look at the meaning of the different elements of Christmas as <a href="#">shown here.</a> Reflect on how we often forget the true meaning. Round off by looking at the story on the clip 'Peace on Earth.'
18/12	<b>Christmas Love</b>	<a href="#">Jesus is Born</a>	<a href="#">John 3:16</a>	Think about how we will show love to others this Christmas just as God showed his love by sending his son Jesus. We will give gifts, but what else could we do that costs little or nothing to show our love for others?
